PAYMENT INFORMATION: Enclose entry fee with form. All fees must be in U.S. dollars. Postmark your entry by Monday, April 26, 2010 to qualify for the Standard Entry Fee. Between April 27 and May 10, 2010, pay the Late Entry Fee. Late entries must be paid in US funds by cashier's check, traveler's check, money order, credit card or PayPal. Credit card and PayPal payments will be assessed an additional 5% merchant finance fee. No personal, business or league checks will be accepted for entries postmarked after April 26, 2010. No entries postmarked after May 10, 2010 will be accepted. No exceptions!

ELIGIBILITY: All players must have played a minimum of eight (8) full matches over a minimum of eight (8) weeks during a sanctioned session in the same ACS/CCS-sanctioned league and meet ACS amateur requirements. ACS Sanctioned Player Members (non-ACS/CCS league) are eligible for participation in 8-Ball and 9-Ball singles divisions of the 2010 ACS National Championships. There are NO minimum or maximum age requirements to enter.

FORMAT

All singles divisions are double-elimination and races to:

Men's 9-Ball Singles	5 (Standard)/ 7 (Open)/ 9 (Masters) – all skill levels play in one Men's 9-Ball division with the respective spot in games.	
Women's 9-Ball Singles	4 (Standard)/ 5 (Open)/ 7 (Masters) - all skill levels play in one Women's 9-Ball division with the respective spot in games.	
Men's Open Singles	5	
Women's Open Singles	4	
Men's Masters Singles	7	
Women's Masters Singles	7	
Men's Standard Singles	5	<i>No added \$ to Standard 8-Ball divisions!</i>

* In the event that a published division fails to meet minimum entry requirements, ACS will include those entrants in the next most suitable division. The ACS will not be liable for any change of division. Entrants will be notified immediately after entries close if a division is cancelled - entrants will have the option to request a refund or be placed in the next most suitable division."

CHECK – IN: Singles and Scotch Doubles entries are not required to check-in onsite, but should stop by the ACS registration desk to collect their tournament "goodie bag."

DRESS CODE: Dress code requirements are established to add to the prestige and respect associated with this most prominent of amateur pool championships. Your cooperation in wearing neat, clean apparel at all times during competition for the betterment of the sport is appreciated.

SINGLES COMPETITION: Men must wear sleeved shirts of polo/golf style or button-down style with a conventional fold-over collar. Women must wear sleeved shirts or blouses of polo/golf style or conventional style with a fold-over collar. Absolutely no T-shirts allowed. Absolutely no sweats, warm-up suits or jogging suits allowed. Men must wear long pants, either dress pants or neat, clean, untorn jeans. Women may wear dress pants, Capri-style pants, or neat, clean, untorn jeans. Women may also wear culottes, skirts or sleeved dresses, of conservative length. Men and women must wear clean, neat, closed-toe shoes at all times. Should a player require a footwear exception for medical reasons, the player must provide a letter on official letterhead from the player's health care provider before the tournament (and keep a copy of this letter in their possession at all times, available for review by a referee, if requested).

GENERAL: The dress code will be in effect and enforced at all times during tournament play. Dress code will NOT be enforced in sections clearly designated for practice and mini-tournaments throughout the Championships.

- A player who attempts to compete while not in dress code will be required by a referee to comply with the dress code before continuing to play.
- Any player found in violation of the dress code during match play will be given 15 minutes to correct the violation and return to the match site. If not back in 15 minutes, the player will lose one game of the match and will lose one additional game for each additional 5 minutes until he/she returns. A Team Captain may not substitute another player for a player found in violation of the dress code until after the player returns in proper attire. Players or teams may protest an opponent's dress code ONLY BEFORE the match begins.

All players must abide by the tournament dress code. Referees are the final authority on dress code at all times. Referees may require immediate compliance or compliance at their discretion.

RIVIERA NON-SMOKING POLICY: Per Nevada law, no smoking is allowed in any non-casino room, hallway or convention space within the Riviera Hotel & Casino.
